
Vale Jack Diamond

It is with great regret that we note that Jack Diamond, aged 91 has passed away.



No 3 side is struggling at the moment and are 10th on the ladder.


No 4 side is also sitting in 10th position on the ladder.

In recognition of the more than 30 years as a member of the bowling club and a great friend to all who knew him there.

Jack had all the attributes of a good clubman and a team player and served the club very well in many official positions. Most notably as Club Secretary for 2 years and Financial Auditor for 9 years. He also served for many years on the RVBA committee and the Garden and Greens committees.

Jack's playing record included a total of 266 Pennant games and a club championship in the Men's Century Handicap in the 1988/89 season. His reputation as a very good draw bowler and outstanding lead was recognised by all pennant and social bowling members.

Jack was greatly admired for his fortitude.

<u>Firstly</u>, when suffering a broken shoulder after falling off a ladder, he continued to bowl by changing from a left hander to a right hander. He practiced long and hard and became very adept and competitive. The club recognised his effort and Jack was presented with the Jenny Macklin encouragement Award for that season.

<u>Secondly</u>, despite his failing eyesight in the latter years he set himself up with some homemade visual aids and again with lots of determination he continued bowling very well for many more years. Jack hardly missed a week of Social Bowls both in summer and winter.

Some extra encouragement to keep up his bowling came the year Jack won the club raffle, which was a set of the latest style of Aero bowls. Everyone was delighted to see Jack change from his old black bowls to a set of red speckled ones. He was able to adapt to these new bowls very well and kept up his reputation as a spot on draw bowler.

Jack was a very amiable member and a gentleman. He was a special person around the club always cheerful and with something of interest to say to all around him.

We were delighted to see Jack continue to bowl until his 90th Birthday.
