He suffered a fall and broken hip on the second of August. He was doing well until suffering heart failure several weeks later. Les passed away peacefully on the nineteenth.


His partner, Janet Tindale, would like to say "Thank you to everyone for their cards and thoughtful messages."

ELTHAM DIVISION 8 METROPOLITAN CHAMPIONS 2008/2009





## GARDENING IN NILLUMBIK by Don White

This is what he is preparing for the next issue.

THE FIRST THING IS TO HAVE GOOD SOIL AND WHAT IS GOOD SOIL?
TO DO THIS RIGHT, YOU SHOULD HAVE A METER THAT GOES INTO
THE SOIL AND GIVES YOU THE PH READING.

ALL PLANTS PREFER A CERTAIN PH BETWEEN 6.5 & 7, BUT I HAVE FOUND THAT BY MAINTAINING A PH LEVEL OF 7, ALL MY PLANTS THRIVE.

Eltham soil has a high level of iron so if need be, then treat it with 1 part AGG lime, 1 part gypsum, 1 part guano, 2 parts blood & bone.

One of the unexpected benefits this strange situation that we all find ourselves in, is that I seem to be spending and enjoying much of my time in the garden.

My wife was the gardener but when she passed on, I started to grow flowers to take to her each fortnight. However, with coronavirus, I found myself drawn to growing vegies so that now my garden extends over approximately 81 square meters



To start, we need to **build beds above ground level as you will find this very helpful later with less bending** by which gardening can make one's back ache.

Use only RED GUM SLEEPERS then you don't have chemicals to worry about. Bunnings only have Treated Pine so go to Mitre 10 in Diamond Creek who have all types of timber and will cut it to size free of charge. When building the beds, attach the sleepers with BATTEN screws in case you wish to alter or repair later.

Make sure you use good soil and add manure (I use horse manure but weed it before using and let it well dry before using) also add blood & bone, Potash & a Slow Release.

Then turn it over with a gardening FORK IT IS MUCH EASIER THAN A SPADE.

I am currently germinating vast quantities of Iceberg Lettuce, Tomatoes, Rocket, Broccoli, Cauliflower, Peas, Beans, Strawberries, in my walk-in Greenhouse which will be transplanted to the garden when the seeds grow to be seedlings about 60mm tall.

I bought Potatoes seeded in May, then stored them in a bin that shuts out all light. Then the potatoes will produce shoots by late August. You can cut the Potatoes in half, but YOU MUST HAVE AT LEAST 2 EYES IN EACH HALF. I use only Sebago Potatoes as they are an all-purpose Potato. You can buy seeds from nurseries, Bunnings, Mitre 10 and online from SEEDS COLLECTION in Ferntree Gully. Free delivery for orders over \$20.

Gardening is a very personal thing and what one likes may not completely suit others so we can just pick the eyes out of all areas. For example at the moment, I am trying Broccoli when the experts say it's the wrong time but with our wacky weather and in a greenhouse, the soil is warmer than normal. Carrots some find hard to grow but with carrots and parsnip you MUST have sandy soil, so I mixed 30% fine sand with Osmacote garden soil and got oversized carrots

Although there is a time suggested to plant different type of vegies by using a greenhouse, you can get results out of season.



If you don't want to have a greenhouse, just get an old ice cream container or any old container and drill a small hole in the bottom. Then if outside, put a clear piece of plastic over it or take it inside near a window for it to get the sun. When transplanting make sure that one plant only goes into each hole.


