Our Vice-President, Brent Arnott, opened proceedings with a welcome to all and especially to our new members.



### **Out onto the New Green**


Reigning Mens Club Champion, Graeme Abblitt, rolled out the ceremonial jack on the new green.

The massed members bowled at the club kookaburra from the edges of the green with Virgel Dimovski closest.








# **Umpires Corner**

The club is still looking for volunteers to train as either measurers or umpires for the coming Pennant season. These positions are very interesting, easy to learn and do, and are vital to the pennant competition. We can teach you all the basics needed one on one at the club before you do any official course, just speak to any current umpire for the details.

## A simple rule for the month #1:

**Spotting the jack**. There are a few cases where the jack needs to be spotted on the "T" (2 metre mark) and although not a huge problem, I find it is very often spotted incorrectly.





The jack is not placed on the "T" but behind it, so the front of the jack lines up with the 2 metre mark on the green.

Dead ends do count in Pennant, so the only time it would need spotting like this in Pennant is if is delivered incorrectly by both leads at the start of any end. In that case the jack is "spotted" and the original lead may place the mat anywhere on the centre line as long as the distance from the front of the mat to the front of the jack is at least 21 metres.

## A simple rule for the month #2:

**Interruption to play in any official match**. Given the not so fantastic weather we are having at the moment it may be necessary to note Law 32.2 in relation to an interruption to the game where the game is officially stopped and the players must leave the green -

32.2 If an end has started but all the required bowls have not been played, it must be declared dead. (The end must be declared dead even if one or more players choose to remain on the green during the stoppage.)





#### ADDITIONAL CARPARKING



This is a map showing access to alternative car parking for Tuesday (Midweek) and Saturday Pennant.

The parking is located at the bottom of Pitt Street (1) and is a sealed carpark offering at least 20 car park spaces.

We call it the "Clancy" car park as it provides "overflow" car parking when the one in Susan Street is fully occupied. (2)

This car park is fully sealed and it is an easy 5 minute walk along sealed pathways to the clubrooms.

You can access the side gate (3) or else walk around the front of the football/cricket pavilion and enter by the main gate. (4)

If you are travelling from Eltham then it is often easier to just continue along Main Road past Bridge Street and turn right at the next intersection down Pitt Street. Then continue down the hill behind the Community Centre where you will see the car park.

It is also a good parking area to meet up with your fellow rink members for when you are travelling for away Pennant games.

P.S. Don't forget to lock the side gate (creek end) when you are leaving at the end of the day's play.
