Tip for all bowlers:

Do you have a pre shot routine? Even a champion like Aaron Sherriff checks the fingers and wanted bias before stepping on the mat. His pre-mat routine: "mentally prepared, bowl in hand OK, know my line, point my feet, set myself, find my weight, deliver."



Saturday Pennant Notice:

There is very little to report at the moment due to the current situation. Unfortunately, it looks like none of the scheduled inter-club practice matches will take place before the commencement of the season, which looks likely to occur in November, similar to last year.

This means that trials for a reformatted tick system won't be able to happen before the season proper. Like most things in the current climate, there will be a delay but eventually things will get back to normal.

There have been a few changes to the Saturday pennant conditions of play for the coming season, the most notable one is allowing of practice before the game as detailed in the following note:

26. Pre-Game Pennant Practice

26.1. Practice is allowed on the day of play including on the rinks the game is to be played on, for both the home and visiting side, up to 30 minutes prior to the commencement of play. If required, the visiting side must have access to half the rinks the game is to be played on.

The only other details to note at this stage is that, if State Covid restrictions allow for a normal season, for divisions 2 to 7 the season will again be only 14 rounds with each section consisting of only 8 teams.

Coaching Tip:

About 80% of Good weight control comes from the head, not the arm. But only once you have a well practiced and consistent action. So you should always do lots of practice without a jack and get that action smooth and "automatic", before practicing with different lengths at drawing to the jack.

Think about it.

The Greens

Despite the problems associated with the lockdown, work on the greens has continued on a regular basis as normally required. Our greenkeeper, Shane Waddingham, has done a lot of research and planning as well as the actual work and we are hopeful, weather permitting, that the grass green will be well established by the start of pennant and the bad patches re-sown by the Christmas break.



The first picture here is the green on the 5th of September, looking very green and so much more advanced than this time last year.

So advanced in fact that it already needs mowing.



Spraying with activated charcoal after mowing to help with the new growth and help reverse the black layer problem in the top few centimetres of soil.



The green has been sprayed twice for algae and moss removal and treated with fertilizers to help with the new growth. There is still a lot more to be done though, and hopefully lots of good warm sunny days from now on will be good.

We are also getting a vital grass grooming machine serviced and ready for the new season. (Has not been used for more than 20 years!)

The synthetic green has also been sprayed for algae and moss removal and work there is continuing.

And you know it is spring when we see our resident guard keeping an eye on the green from the clubhouse steps last Sunday morning.


UPDATING THE WEBSITE FOR THE NEW SEASON - Steve Veitch

I have been updating the club website in recent weeks. You can click through to the site here - https://www.elthambowlsclub.com.au/


With ever more information to be made available to members and visitors, I have previously rearranged where various pages are kept.

The ABOUT US Menu


