A word from our Secretary:

Hopefully we've weathered the last of the lock downs for now, it's great to get out and enjoy the great outdoors with our family and friends and complimented with warmer weather and a weekly top up of rain for the garden. With a further easing of restrictions late last month we can now have greater numbers on the greens and our density quotient allows the club to have up to 50 people inside. The Board is implementing both Government and Bowls Vic guidelines regarding eligibility to bowl, only fully vaccinated people or those with an exemption, will be able to attend. Those members who have not let the secretary know their vaccination status please do as soon as possible, plus proof of vaccination status needs to be sighted by the secretary before returning to bowls. Please note members who do not provide proof of vaccination will be ineligible to bowl until proof of vaccination is sighted.

A very handy tip regarding your COVID Certificate please carry a paper copy of your certificate, just in case your phone goes flat, or you forget your phone plus ID to save frustration and disappointment when playing at away clubs, as most clubs will be operating under hospitality guidelines when their clubrooms & Bars are open, their greens will most likely be included in the red line area, as per government guideline you will need to show proof of being fully vaccinated.

We had a great turn out for our first weekend pennant -intra club practise last Saturday; a little bit of housekeeping when games are finished please hang the bowls scoops back up on their hooks in the shelters this will help prevent accidents. Please remember only spray or liquid chalk can be used to mark bowls.

The format of Practice Match One may have been a little onerous for some, especially those who played on the grass which hadn't been cut due to inclement weather, but it did give the opportunity to compete against quite a number of players.






Garden Committee Report



Greens Report

The grass green is looking in great shape and beginning to roll well. Our greenkeeper Shane has done a fantastic job. And in a few weeks time the two bad areas on rink 14 will have the top four or five centimetres removed and replaced with new soil and replanted with tiff dwarf grass stolons from the "nursery" area on rink 13. Hopefully, with some good warm weather following, the whole green will look complete by Christmas.



We have had our grass grooming machine cleaned and repaired and already in operation to give us a good bowling speed eventually of 14+ seconds. I say there is nothing better than bowling on a good grass green.

If you haven't noticed yet the picture on the left is the area at the end of rink 10 that used to be rather bare and very ordinary looking for about 4 years. Now plugged with good grass plugs from rink 14, and soon to blend in well with the surrounding grass. The spot on rink 9 has had the same treatment. Thanks to Shane for the instructions and to Helen for helping with the work.

The synthetic green has been sprayed with a protector to begin the process of eradicating the algae, moss and resulting black stains that have unfortunately appeared in the past 18 months. This process will take about 12 months to hopefully leave us with a stain free woven carpet. The chemicals have been supplied by Bowling Green Supplies in Queensland and Shane is doing the spraying. Time will tell but hopefully that will also be a successful operation.




Deck Furniture Cleanup Day
