We produced a "huge" pile of vegetation and over 3 days, it was taken to the council green waste disposal by Glen and Di Debney with assistance of some of our club members. We were also able to undertake the task of removing some the roofing on the shelter (for better access) to the synthetic green and to also take off the shelter rooves on the grass green to minimise shading over the winter.

#### ELTHAM BOWLING CLUB 2018 FORTY/40 COMPETITION

Another successful competition of **Forty/40**, has been completed at the Eltham Bowling Club. This competition is played on Friday evenings from 6.00pm to 7.30pm during February and March with the final night being played on March 23rd.

There were 10 teams participating this year. The competition was divided into two sections. Section 1 consisted of 6 teams who played each other and a final was contested on the 6<sup>th</sup> week. Section 2 comprised 4 teams who played a two round competition.

In an endeavour to keep the competition as even as possible a number of the teams are handicapped with this handicap being revised after three weeks of competition.

As Forty/40 is no longer a Bowls Victoria sanctioned competition, this year there was a \$20 per team. Entry fee and participants paid \$5 each week to compete in the competition. Each week there was prize money for winners and runners-up as well as a winner and runner-up prize at the end of the competition.

#### What is Forty/40?

Forty/40 is a quick bowls game designed for members of the community who have no or limited bowling experience. It's fun, fast, social and competitive.

The format is 2 bowl triples played over 12 ends ( $2 \times 6$  end halves). Each takes approximately forty minutes to play, thus Forty/40.

There are a few other rules pertaining to Forty/40. Each player rotates position after every 2 ends. The mat is always placed on the 2mT and the winner of each decides on the length by placing the jack on the centre line. There are no dead ends and each team is allowed one powerplay each half. The powerplay team gets double their shots on the powerplay end. The committee would like to thank the people who manned the bar during this competition as well as Ros Camera and John Sharp who helped on the green.


