Green's Report

The grass green is at last starting to look better because of favorable weather conditions and the ongoing maintenance program. The green keeper has continued to treat the poa, moss and algae with his chemical spraying programs. Also we continue to fertilize the green with liquid fertilizer.

The green gets mowed twice a week on Monday and Thursday mornings and we try to roll the green before pennant on Tuesdays and Saturday mornings as well as Thursday before practice. I applaud the Wednesday social bowlers for their patience because so far they

have not had the opportunity to play on the grass green. We hope we can get this group onto the green as soon as the conditions and the weather improves. Future programs will include coring and scarifying the green later in the year. Other works carried out are the repairs to the bowls rakes, repairs to the shelter on the synthetic green and the conversion of the boom spray to a portable 12volt dc pumping system.

We have also purchased a new score board and that has been installed. In finishing as always, I would like to thank my team for their ongoing support. I have also had informal meetings with Nillumbik council member Meralyn Klein regarding our tree problems (shading etc.) and if she gets re-elected she will push our cause to have the trees heavily trimmed.

Website Tour, part 2

Last month, we looked at how player records can be looked at on the website. This month, we look at the other interesting things stored on the site.


C'SHIPS – the gateway to all club championships. The sub-menu items provide access. (For the curious among us, the menu item says "C'SHIPS" rather than "CHAMPIONSHIPS" because the latter would make the main menu items expand to 2 lines.)

Men's Events – explains the format of all men's events and the winners beginning with the first in 1982/83.

Men's Summary – summarises the events won by all male players. When you first access the page the details of each event won are hidden.



Clicking on the plus sign inside the box reveals the events won. The record of Ernie Richards is a good one to look at.




Winning 36 championship events is very impressive. The most impressive part of these is the almost unbroken run of singles titles from 2001/02 to 2008/09. Frank Camera is to blame for Ernie's 2002/03 gap year.

Women's Events – goes into the same detail as on the Men's Events page.

Women's Summary – Ros Camera is the equivalent to Ernie on the women's side.

Mixed Events – gives a brief description of each event and the winners

Region Event Winners – lists all Eltham winners of region (formerly called "group") events. This is a big deal because it means the players were the best performed out of the roughly 20 clubs in our region.

EVENTS – has details on social bowls, our regular 3rd Monday triples, tournaments and special events.


HISTORY – the first page has a brief history of the club. The real contributions of members to our history is in the sub-menu items

Life Members – lists all 10 of them with a photo where we have one.

Special Achievements – we have 2 special achievements honour boards in the clubrooms, over the bar and at the rear. This lists them all from both boards chronologically.

Previous Office Bearers – holders of the main official positions over the years.

Volunteer Positions Held – there are 2 of these pages where the information can be accessed according to who held what position or what position each person has held. Like the summary of the winners of men's and women's events, the whole story is revealed by clicking on the plus sign inside the box. Here is what is revealed when you see what positions our most recent life member has held.



This is little more than half of it. Meryl's had a busy 17 years.
