

The new planted area on rinks 13 and 14 is coming along very well. The new grass is looking quite mature and growing runners in all directions. This has just been mowed for the first time and top dressed and will be ready to blend in with the rest of the green in a few weeks. We will definitely have all 7 rinks available for bowling next season. Shane has done a fantastic job fixing up those two very bad areas, lots of hard work over the past 10 months.

Saturday Pennant Notice:

As we approach the last phase of the season I'm happy to report that, as a Club, we continue to do well in regards to Sat pennant bowls.

Currently we have 4 of our 5 pennant sides in contention to play finals:

Div 2 - Second on the ladder, well clear of third placed Lalor and only 9 points behind first placed Hurstbridge.

Div 3 - Third on the ladder behind Lalor and Montmorency.

Div 4 - Second on the ladder.

Div 6 - Fourth on the ladder but 32 points clear of fifth place Hurstbridge.

Unfortunately our Div 5 side has struggled a bit this year but have definitely improved as the year has progressed; recording their first win last week over third placed Donvale.

These great results couldn't be achieved without the participation of our group of emergency players; especially in these tough Covid times. The selectors would like to thank these players as a group as, without their contribution, the Club couldn't be as successful as it is.

At this time of the year selectors have to take another item into consideration which is qualifying players for the finals. This can mean not promoting players, even though their performance warrants it, to keep them eligible to play in particular divisions and also getting as many players qualified as possible to play finals. So, players may be dropped back even though they're doing ok for the overall benefit of the Club.

Finally, if we can manage to get 4 of our 5 pennant sides playing finals AGAIN this year the Club will have achieved great success.



1) The club coaches are still running weekly Drills and Skills sessions this season.


Thursday mornings, 10am, afternoons 3pm, and evenings 5.30pm.
