## REGISTRATION

One of the early requirements of running the Tournament involved the publicity and registering of interested teams.

Brochures were drawn up and printed and the entire committee armed themselves with copies for the start of the bowling season. Helen and Frank sent copies to Bowls Victoria for publicity on their website. Most clubs were happy to display these notices on their notice boards.

There were only about four entries before Christmas but this was expected. By the end of January we had perhaps ten teams on board and really felt at that time we would be certainly going ahead with our plans. February saw the entry fill to twenty-four teams with three later unable to get a game.



As these extra entries were not until the last week before Tournament Day it was felt that rather than squeeze another two teams (catering had already been organized) it was better to cutoff entry at that point.

Kilmore had been given brochures at the Victorian Open which I thought was optimistic. Little did I know they would in fact enter two teams in the end. There were four clubs who entered two teams.

A reminder was sent to all entries in the week prior to bring it to front of mind and gave them an opportunity to let me know about dietary needs and whether they would be needing a substitute.

On the day of the tournament registration involved collecting payments (thank you Pam) and distributing an envelope with lucky door prize tickets, three section game card (made by Helen) and Conditions of play advice.
